- 2. Refunds:**
 - a. Full refund before closing date except \$35 administrative fee and any online processing fees.
 - b. After the closing date and up to 14 days before the competition upon presentation of a Veterinarian or Doctor's certificate, there will be a refund of 50% of the class fees, 50% of the stabling fees, and 100% of any haul-in or camping fees.
 - c. No refunds of any type will be made if notice of cancellation is received later than two weeks before the date of the show.
- 3. Returned Payments:**
 - a. There will be a \$50.00 penalty charged by management for any entry payments returned by the bank.

Skyreach Equestrian Center Vaccination Policy

Equine Vaccination Requirements

Horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

1. **All horses are required to provide proof of vaccinations no later than 5:00pm on the Wednesday before the show.** If we do not receive your vaccination records, you will not be allowed on the grounds, and we will not refund your entry or any associated fees.
2. Negative EIA/Coggins within 12mo is required for all out of state entries.
3. Health Certificates are required for all out-of-state competitors.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Rules

- 1. Show Office Hours:** Open one hour prior to the first ride of each day and will close 30 minutes after the last class of the day. The day before the competition starts, the office will be open from 2 PM to 6 PM.
- 2. Additional Show Personnel:** Veterinarian and Farrier will be on call; names and contact information will be posted at the Show Office.
- 3. Entries:** Observe Opening and Closing dates published on each show title page. Entries received before the opening date may be returned. Online Entries through HorseShowOffice are accepted. The show can be filled prior to the "Closing Date".
- 4. Waitlist Entries:** Entries received after the classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a waiting list.
- 5. Post Entries:** Management reserves the right to accept post entries if space allows in the case of cancellation. Post entry fee: \$25.00.
- 6. Minor Exhibitors:** No entry by a Minor will be accepted unless it is signed by a parent or guardian.
- 7. Rules are in accordance with United States Rules for Working Equitation available on [USAWE.org](https://usawe.org/Competitions)>Competitions**
- 8. Participants must be members of USAWE (Except schooling rides) <https://usawe.org/become-a-member/>**
- 9. Horse Requirements. All horses must be recorded with USAWE. A one-time fee of \$30 per horse includes lifetime performance tracking. The form is completed online at <https://usawe.org/competitors/record-your-horse/>**
- 10. Tests:** All Tests are the current USAWE tests. Show conducted according to USAWE rules.
- 11. Schedule:** Riders with multiple horses entered in different classes will be scheduled with the goal to allow 45 minutes between rides. Please provide your own support to accommodate that timeframe. Riders riding multiple horses in the same class may have less than 45 minutes between rides, please plan accordingly.
- 12. Awards:** Ribbons 1st through 4th place. Prize to first place and highpoint winners. Unclaimed tests/ribbons or music will be held at the show office for 2 days after the show. If you cannot stay for results after your ride, please designate someone to pick them up. Unclaimed materials will not be mailed.
- 13. Vaccination Rule:** Vaccination records must be submitted with your entry. Non-compliant entries will be denied entry and permission to unload and will not be allowed to mingle with other horses or compete. No refunds will be given if the right to compete is denied because the Vaccination Record is missing or incomplete. **Whether the horse is vaccinated by a veterinarian, or by an owner or agent, documentation is required.** Upload or email the appropriate, completed and signed documents prior to the Wednesday before the competition arrival begins.
- 14. Combinations/Cancellation of Classes:** Show management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes where fewer than three (3) horses are entered or limit the size of classes as necessary. Show management also reserves the right to change the order of the classes as they are listed in the Prize list. Competitors in changed classes will be notified. Classes canceled because of weather may be rescheduled or remain canceled. NO REFUNDS. Show management reserves the right to substitute judges if necessitated by illness or other unforeseen event which makes it impossible for the advertised judge to be present at the show. The classes may not be scheduled in the order they are listed.

- 15. Ride Times:** Riding schedule will be e-mailed to each **RIDER** by the Wednesday before the show with the final ride times posted on HorseShowOffice no later than noon prior to the day of the show. ***If ride times are not received, it is the responsibility of the rider to contact Show Management. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.***
- 16. No shows (or scratches):** All “No Shows” that have not checked in with the show office a minimum of 45 minutes prior to their first ride and picked up their exhibitor numbers will be considered a “scratch”. There are no refunds for scratched entries or classes. Scratches by competitors on the show grounds are official ONLY when made to the Show Secretary. Scratches made to warm-up or ring stewards are not official and may be considered NO SHOWS. If the competitor cannot come to the show office to scratch in person, they may send a representative.
- 17. Release of Responsibility:** USAWE, Skyreach Farm, Show Officials, Show Management, and/or employees and volunteers will not be responsible for any accident and/or loss that may occur to any exhibitor or his agent, horse, and/or equipment on premises including stabling. Washington State Equine Limitation of Liability Act RCW4.24 applies to all Equestrians Institute shows, at any facility used. Horses, by their inherent nature, present a risk of injury, harm or death. Riders represent that they are qualified to participate at the level entered. Each exhibitor is responsible for any injury or harm, that may be occasioned to any person, whomsoever, by any horse owned or exhibited by said exhibitor, and shall hold harmless and indemnify any agencies or persons listed above, against all claims or demands, of any nature or kind, that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horses owned or exhibited by them, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of such horse. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damage to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. All horses exhibited at these shows participate entirely at the owner’s or rider’s risk.
- 18. Special Release:** By signing the entry agreement, the signor further agrees to: *“release and indemnify and hold harmless USAWE, its instructors, officers, directors, agents, and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability or damage arising from or because of, or in connection with, participation in this competition or related activities. The signor also hereby agrees to release, indemnify, and hold harmless the show management, show committee and members, officers, directors, agents, and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability, or damage arising from or because of, or in connection with, participation in this competition or related activities.”*
- 19. Decisions:** *All judges’ decisions are final. If a judge or management decides that an animal is not fit to show, the decision will be final.*
Disputes: Any disputes or problems during the show should be brought to the attention of the show manager.
- 20. Disqualification:** Grounds for disqualification and expulsion without a refund:
- unsportsmanlike conduct
 - use of severe bits or training devices
 - unruly or out-of-control horses
 - mistreatment of any horse or student as determined by management or judges
 - exhibiting a horse that is exhausted, injured, or lame
- 21. Sharps Containers:** Approved sharps containers are available on the show grounds. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- 22. No Drones for any reason.**

Facility

1. **Arenas:** All tests will be ridden on sand/felt. Warm-up will be in hog fuel footing 20x40 meters arena or Sand/Felt. The competition arena is sand/felt and is a regulation arena, 20x40 meters. Lunging is only permitted in the round pen.
2. **Stabling:** Main barn indoor and Show barn outdoor permanent stabling is available. All stabling is for Friday through Sunday – Indoor \$180, Outdoor (20 STALLS) \$150. Tack stalls, \$120, available only at the discretion of show management. Indoor stalls are fully enclosed 14 x 16 wood stalls; outdoor stalls are fully enclosed 12 x 12 wood stalls and all have full, solid doors. Two bags of bedding are included. Extra bedding is available for \$15/bag. Stalls must be stripped before leaving the show or an additional \$25.00 fee must be paid. Do not attach anything to the stall doors or competitors will be charged for damages. No modifications or nailing/screwing on or in stalls allowed. Any damage to stalls will incur a minimum \$150 damage fee.

Show management reserves the right to prioritize which entries get stabling so it may not be “first come, first served.”

3. **Food:** Limited food service available.
4. **Trailer/Exhibitor Parking:** Please abide by the signs and follow the instructions of the personnel that will be helping exhibitor’s park. Park in the same direction/location as other trailers. Park as close to the trailer next to you as reasonably safe. Exhibitors will be working from their trailers, so please leave reasonable space. ***Leave driveway aisle clear through parking area to allow vehicle movements.***
5. **Camping:** Dry camping is available to any adult staying onsite overnight not in an RV hooked up to utilities. Fee of \$25 per night per adult covers costs for porta johns and trash.
6. **Dogs:** Dogs are not allowed on the show grounds except with permission of management. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. No leading dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs’ behaviors.
7. **Smoking** is not permitted anywhere on the show grounds or stable area.
8. Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where these events will occur; provided, that, this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to the revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any other purpose other than that granted herein shall be deemed a criminal trespass and subject to the appropriate legal proceedings.

RELEASE:

I understand that this is a high-risk sport and I am participating at my own risk. I hereby assume this risk and further do hereby release and hold harmless the organizer (Licensee), organizing committee, competition management, judges and officials; USA Working Equitation (USAWE), its officers, agents, employees and volunteers; the host of this event or competition; and the owners of any property on which the event or competition is being held, from all liability for negligence resulting in accidents, damage, injury, or illness to myself and to my property, including the horse or horses that I will compete at this event or competition.

ENTRY AGREEMENT:

By entering a USAWE-licensed competition and signing this entry form as the Owner, Rider, or Parent/Guardian, I agree that I am subject to and agree to be bound by the Bylaws of USAWE applicable to the USAWE-licensed competition, the U.S. Rules for Working Equitation ("Rules"), and the requirements of the competition as stated in the Prize List. I will accept as final the decision of the Protests Committee or Appeals Committee on any question arising under the Rules and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, USAWE, their officials, officers, directors, employee, agents, personnel, volunteers, and USAWE affiliates for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, USAWE and/or competition management may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage, or benefit of the competition, sport, or USAWE. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. I understand and agree that copies of scoresheets may be retained for Licensed Officials Committee judge training purposes only.

In consideration for my participation in this Competition, **I AGREE to the following:**

- o I AGREE that USAWE and the Competition as used herein include the Licensee and competition management, as well as all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, and USAWE affiliates.
- o I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse as a rider, owner, or parent/guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").
- o I AGREE to hold harmless and release USAWE and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of USAWE or the Competition.
- o I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of USAWE or the Competition.
- o I AGREE to indemnify USAWE and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition I have read the Rules about protective equipment (section 1.9.1.j) and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty. I acknowledge that USAWE strongly encourages me to do so while warning that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching, and abilities to safely compete in this competition.
